Warrior Mascot Renewal

The Philomath School District and the Confederated Tribes of The Siletz Indians (CTSI) have agreed on a new five-year renewal for the use of the Warrior mascot at PHS. A requirement of the agreement is that we begin a phased-in plan of curriculum developed by CTSI for instructional implementation during the 2022-2023 school year that will allow for full implantation of CTSI curriculum in the 2023-2024 school year. The curriculum was created because of the need for historically accurate and culturally relevant curriculum in Oregon schools about Oregon Native Tribes.

We ask that you take a moment to stop what you are doing, to listen to these words as we recognize the land that we currently inhabit. No matter where each of us is physically located in Philomath, we must understand that we are on traditional homelands and unceded territories of indigenous peoples. Where we live, these are the ancestral homelands for the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians.
