Pre- Arranged Absences

Attending school is the first step of the learning process for students. Regular and punctual attendance is often

times the student's responsibility, but by Oregon law, it is the parent's responsibility to make sure students attend school.

The law states that any student may be excused from school by pre-arranged absence for the purpose of vacation, hunting, family reunion, etc. for a period of time "not to exceed five days in a term of three months or not to exceed ten days in any term of at least six months" (ORS 339.065) After the excused limit is exceeded, the absence will be coded as "Pre-Arranged Unexcused."

Unexcused absences will affect admittance to quarterly Passport activities. All prearranged absences requests must be submitted in writing to the Assistant Principal, Chad Matthews prior to the planned absence.

Immunization Requirements

Please make sure your child's immunizations are up to date, or that exempt

letters are turned in by February 19, 2020. You should have received notification from the school district nurse if the record is not up to date. If your child's immunizations are incomplete, they will be unable to attend school after the exclusion date, which is February 19, 2020.

Immunization clinic hours are limited. We encourage families to seek appointments for vaccinations in advance of February. Families can seek immunization at their doctor's office or clinic, the Benton County Health Department, or at a pharmacy for children over the age of seven years old.

Children without health insurance are eligible for free or very low cost vaccines at the Benton County Health Department. To schedule an appointment please call 541-766-6812.
