Also...the spring Box Top Competition will be held at PES from February 11th—22nd. The grade levels will be competing against each other to see who can bring in the most.


#### Girls on the Run

# Attendance Matters

Student attendance continues to be a positive goal of focus for Philomath Elementary and Blodgett schools. At the elementary level, it is very important for students to be on time and in class each and every day. Since we know attendance at school matters a great deal, here are some tips to help support your efforts

- Set a regular bed time and morning routine
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session.
- Don't let your child stay home unless he/she is truly sick. Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home.

#### School and Illness:

The following guidelines will help you decide whether your child is too ill to go to school. Your child is too ill to go to school if he or she has any of these signs:

- \* Has vomiting or diarrhea (Do NOT send until student is FREE OF symptoms for 24 hours)
- \* Break out in a rash; not all rashes require that a child stay home from school. Check with your child's doctor. Impetigo would require staying home until treated with an antibiotic for 24 hours.
- \* Fever: Your child should not go to school if they have a temperature at or above 100.0\* F. Student may return to school after they are feeling better (a temp. below 100.0\*F without a fever reducer in their system).
- \* Contagious Disease: Your child should stay home from school if he/she has a contagious disease. A contagious disease is one that can be spread by close contact with a person or object. Examples are: chickenpox, flu, vomiting, diarrhea, colds, strep throat and "pinkeye." A disease may be contagious before the child shows signs of illness. It is very hard to prevent the spread of some germs, especially in a school classroom. Good hand washing will help prevent the spread of germs in most settings.

During cold and flu season please pay extra attention to signs and symptoms. We want all individuals to stay as healthy as possible! Good hand washing will help prevent the spread of germs in most settings.
