





State Goals





PES is committed to a safe, secure learning environment. PES believes in providing equitable support for all students. Our school utilizes Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) to guide student behavior. Our school counselor also teaches several small groups to support specific student needs throughout the year. All students understand the Zones of Regulation, practicing social and emotional regulation for self-control.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

PES sponsors the annual Oregon Battle of the Books and our Music program puts on several performances during the year. Before school Band is offered to 5th graders and Choir is offered to 4th and 5th graders. We've continued to partner with the Philomath Youth Activities Club (PYAC) to support after school programs to the extent possible.


