

Following the Metrics: Criteria for In-Person Instruction

This dashboard provides an interpretation of each county's Oregon Health Authority (OHA) COVID-19 data (percent testing positive, case rate per 100,000, and case count) in terms of the Oregon Department of Education's requirements for reopening schools to in-person instruction. Reading the Dashboard Indicators:

- A green check indicates these conditions may apply to the selected county IF the additional criteria in *Following the Metrics* are met.
- A red X indicates the county's data does not meet the criteria for that condition.
- A yellow exclamation point indicates the condition does not yet apply, but keep an eye on the data because it is trending negatively.
- A grey circle indicates this allowance is not available to the selected county.

1. Criteria for In-Person Instruction:

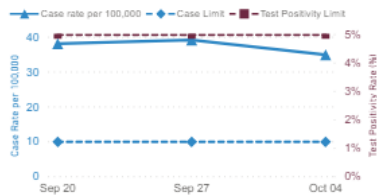
County and State meet the standard to open In-Person Instruction (A red X indicates the county MUST be in Comprehensive Distance Learning unless any of the below *Statewide Exceptions* and *County Allowances* apply.)

If in-person, a green check indicates conditions have changed and a plan must be developed or be ready for transitioning to Comprehensive Distance Learning. If district is not in In-Person Instruction, a yellow ! simply indicates a negative trend.

County metrics allow schools who've previously opened fully In-Person to continue. A red X signals the need for schools who were operating In-Person to return to Comprehensive Distance Learning.

⚠ For any green checks below, watch the blue and yellow boxes above for a yellow exclamation point or red X indicating the county's data is negatively trending.

Solid line should be below matching dotted line.
