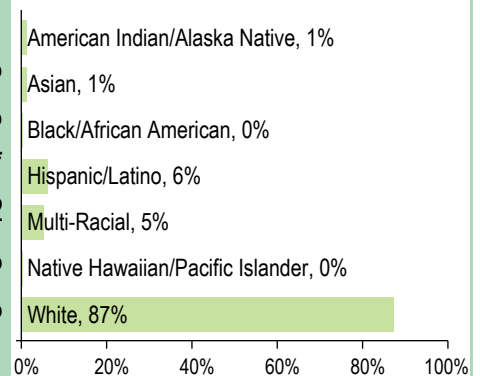

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

- The process of individualizing education for students at the KVCS enables many students to make progress for the first time
- We have a half-time licensed teacher for remediation and additional support is provided by instructional assistants
- Talented and gifted students also receive academic support to ensure they achieve to their potential

ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

- French and Italian classes are offered in High School
- French is offered in Middle School
- Chinese is offered in grades 1 to 5
- AP Courses are offered for high school students. Students from grades 9th through 12th grade attempt AP Sciences, History, Literature and Government courses.
- Honors courses in Literature are also available
- Students in grades K to 5 participate in a gardening program
- Field Trip opportunities are available to all students
- Oregon Battle of the Books
- Outdoor education programs.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

KVCS is growing its CTE program. We currently have culinary classes and have plans to grow the program into agricultural sciences and natural resources. Students in 12th grade participate in an internship experience.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Middle School School students have participated with Falls City School district for many programs. Students in High School have access to athletics through their home district. We strive to ensure student have multiple opportunities to build relationships and have new experiences. High school students have opportunities for overnight field trips to exciting locations around the state.

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
