# **Graduation cords explained**

The following are graduation honor cords and criteria that can be earned by PHS graduates:



**Military** - For those students enlisting in the military or accepting an ROTC scholarship or military academy appointment.

**ASB** - For those students who have been an ASB executive officer, a class officer for two or more years, and ASB class enrollment for at least three terms.

**CTE** - For those students that are a CTE program completer (three+ credits within a program).

**Performing Arts** - For those students with nine trimesters in a music class and a 3.0 or better GPA.

**Robotics** - For students who have been active team members for at least two full seasons, served in a leadership capacity for at least one season, and participated in team outreach and fundraising activities.

**Honors** - 3.5 GPA or above, have taken math through pre-calculus, taken an extra social science class, and have two years of a world language.

**NHS** - Have a GPA of 3.5 or higher, attended eight of 10 NHS meetings, paid dues, earned six volunteer hours per trimester (or a total of 18), be a member in good standing.

PHS rolls out new referral system

As some of you know, last year we began calling parents/guardians with Positive Referrals from teachers. This was PHS staff's way of communicating with families how great our students are. This year, because of the volume of calls (which is a great thing) we have automated the process a little. We didn't want administrators' schedules to be a barrier to families getting the positive communication from the staff. This doesn't mean you




won't ever get a call, but you will always receive an email from the teacher sharing the great thing that your child did in class that day or recently. These will be sent out at the end of the day.

As we were looking at this process, Mr. Henderson felt that it is important that families also get information when their child receives a Behavior Referral to admin and letting parents know what steps were taken by the teacher in the classroom. So with that being said, any time a teacher fills out an office referral, families will receive an email with the general information regarding the incident that took place. These emails will be sent out at the time of submission from the teacher to the office.

Our hope is that this new system will be a more effective communication tool that will encourage and support our students and families. You should begin to experience Positive Referrals this week, I know teachers have been anxiously waiting to celebrate our students' greatness with you!

## **PSAT offered at PHS Oct. 25**



We will be offering the PSAT on October 25. Interested 10th and 11th grade students will sign up using this link.

This year, a fee is required to take the test. The fee is \$18 and can be paid to the PHS main office. Students who need assistance with this fee can see Ms. Drennen for support, as we do not want cost to be a barrier. The test will be digital this year, and students
