

# Signing up for 2024-2025 classes

# **Prospective Family Night planned**



# Mid-Valley STEM-CTE Hub hosts podcast with local scientists

Women and gender minorities make up just over 25% of the workforce in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM), and men vastly outnumber women majoring in most STEM fields in college. The gender gaps are particularly high in some of the fastest-growing and highest-paid jobs of the future, like computer science and engineering. In trades occupations, this gap is even



larger with women only making up just 9% of the workforce in construction and other skilled trades occupations.

Check out the <u>"Closing the Gap" podcast</u> to hear about local women working in these careers. It highlights professional women and gender minorities from our region who are working in STEM & Trades fields.


