## Boys & Girls Cross Country both finish 2nd at State

The PHS cross country teams both placed second at the state meet continuing Philomath High's outstanding achievement in the sport. Results included nine runners receiving All-State honors:

- 1st team All-State - Ben Hernandez and Adele Beckstead
- 2nd Team All-State - Mateo Candanoza and Brody Bushnell
- 3rd Team All-State - Leo Pausch, Ana Candanoza and Ingrid Hellesto
- Honorable Mention All-State - Lucy King and Jesse Erickson

Combined PHS Cross Country Programs have won 36 state meet trophies, 26 of them are 1st or 2nd place finishes. Here is the breakdown from Coach Fulton:

- 1st Place - 12 trophies (8 for Girls, 4 for Boys)
- 2nd Place - 14 trophies (4 for Girls, 10 for Boys)
- 3rd Place - 6 trophies (4 for Girls, 2 for Boys)
- 4th Place - 4 trophies (2 for Girls, 2 for Boys)

Eighty five Oregon High Schools have never won a single top-four trophy for boys and 71 that have never won a trophy for girls.

## Attendance Questions: When to stay home?

There has been a lot of confusion this year regarding attendance and when to come to school and when to stay home. Here is a guide that should help:

### Too Sick for School?

**Students can go to school if:**

- They have a runny nose or little cough, but no other symptoms
- They haven't taken any fever-reducing medicine for 24 hours, and have been fever-free during that time
- They haven't thrown up or had diarrhea for 24 hours

**Keep students home if:**

- They have a temperature higher than 100 degrees even after taking medicine
- They are throwing up or have diarrhea
- Their eyes are pink and crusty

**Call the doctor if:**

- They have a temperature higher than 100 degrees for more than two days
- They've been throwing up or have diarrhea for more than two days
- They've had the sniffles for more than a week, and aren't getting better

In order to participate in a sport, students must:

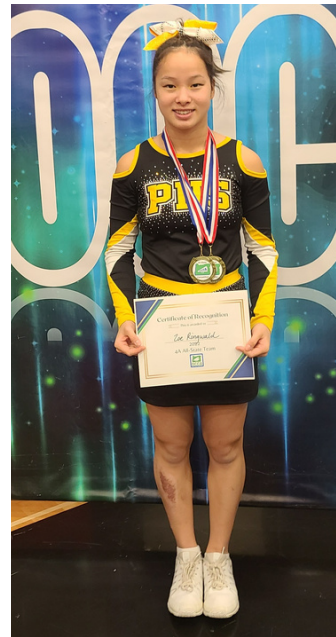
- Be enrolled as a full-time student
