Some of these scholarships require that students apply, and others students are considered for automatically. Become familiar with the college's scholarship portal. Financial Aid award letters are going out, and these will help seniors identify how big the gap is between what it costs to attend versus the financial aid they are going to receive. Scholarships can help cover this gap.

Erin's Law

PHS to begin sexual abuse prevention lessons

Oregon Law, Senate Bill 856 passed in July 2015, mandates that students receive age-appropriate instruction to help them recognize and respond to unsafe situations, and increase awareness of child sexual abuse. You may have heard of this legislation under its more common name, "Erin's Law."

Erin's Law is named after childhood sexual assault survivor, author, speaker and activist Erin Merryn. In 2012, Erin introduced the legislation in her home state of Illinois, requiring that all public schools implement prevention-oriented child sexual abuse programs. The bill was named after her by the legislators, and it has been adopted by 31 states.

PHS is going to provide the first lesson during homeroom on Jan.23. Our goal through this program is for all students to be well informed, valued, respected and safe.

The topics that will be taught are: Relationships 101 (defining healthy & unhealthy relationships), Consent, Four Types of Abuse, and Resources and Options. 
