The concept behind Special Olympics Unified Sports is simple yet powerful: people with and without intellectual disabilities playing together on the same team is a quick path to friendship and social inclusion. The program is driven by fun, development of new skills and talents supported by positive attitudes, community activation and engagement. We call the teammates with intellectual disabilities "athlete," the players without intellectual disabilities "partners." The goal of unified sports is to provide meaningful involvement for both athletes and partners together on one team with one goal.
