Congratulations to the 70.8 percent of seniors who have submitted the FAFSA, and the 79 percent who have applied to college!! As we move through February, any seniors who need support planning their next steps after high school will meet with Ms. Drennen. It is our goal to ensure that each one of our 89 seniors have a plan for after high school, whether it be attending a four-year college or university or a trade school program through a community college, seeking a one-year certificate or two-year associates degree from a community college, enlisting in the military, completing a service experience, or committing to an excellent work opportunity with benefits, training opportunities, and opportunities to advance.

Twenty-five seniors have applied for the <u>Oregon Promise</u>. This is a must for any senior planning to attend LBCC or any other community college in Oregon. Mrs. Drennen recommends all seniors complete the short grant application (15 minutes), as there are always unforeseeable circumstances, and it keeps this

money available if plans change.

Please stop by the Counseling Center to pick up various local scholarship applications. Many scholarships are due at the end of February. Always check the deadline when applying for a scholarship, as late applications are not accepted.

- <u>Benton Community Foundation</u> scholarships are due on Feb.
- OSAC scholarships are due March 1.
- <u>Philomath Community Foundation</u> scholarships are due April 15.









Reoprt concerns to SafeOregon tipline

We wanted to remind you of a resource for reporting school safety concerns. <u>SafeOregon</u> is a program created for students, parents, school staff, community members and law enforcement officers to report and respond to student safety threats.

The goal of SafeOregon is to prevent school safety threats from occurring by providing schools and communities with a relevant tool for reporting potential threats. Tips can be submitted in a variety of ways, including email, phone calls, text, our mobile app and our web portal.


