LBCC is hosting a free CTE Exploration
Tour for students. The tour will take
place two nights a week over a threeweek period. This will be a
comprehensive exploratory experience
in the following programs: nondestructive testing, machine tool,
CADD, and welding. The schedule is

There is also a Discussion Guide. This guide is intended to be given to family, teachers, counselors. This guide explains their particular aptitudes and interests in a way that others can understand, and then better help you.

Once your child has read through the Results Summary and Discussion Guide, the website is opened for them to explore:
