11th-grade state testing

April 11 is the first day for annual testing for our 11th graders. They will be completing the science test. Here are a couple of things to keep in mind if your child is taking this test:

- Reduce screen time a few hours before bed.
- Reduce caffeine consumption in the late afternoon to evening time.
- Get to bed early, getting 8-10 hours of sleep.
- Eat a good dinner the night before the test.
- Eat a balanced breakfast high in protein.

Philomath uses these test results to monitor our programs, making adjustments as needed to prepare PHS students for their futures.

It is important that these test are taken seriously. Students should take time to read questions thoroughly and pick the best answer to each question.

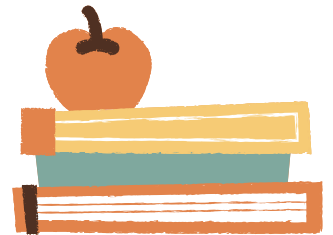

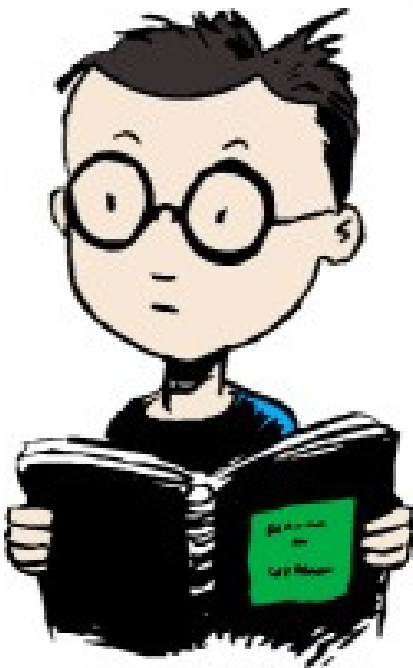

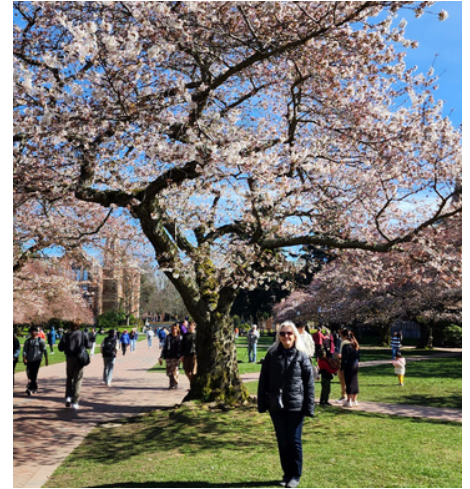
PHS staff members share some of their break highlights

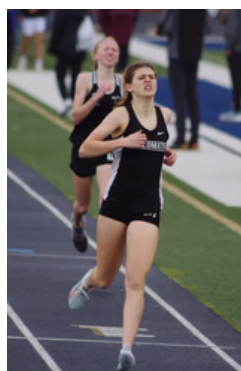
