

Common questions regarding Immunizations:

Is your student completely up to date on immunizations? Please contact your provider's office for verification.

What proof of immunizations are needed? If your student is up to date the school requires proof. Proof of immunizations can be provided, by filling out the immunization form available at the school. A copy from your provider's office can be mailed, faxed, or brought to the school.

How do I claim a non-medical exemption? If you would like to claim a non-medical exemption for your student please visit the website listed below. View the video, mark each immunization you are claiming a non-medical exemption for, print out the form, sign and bring it to the school.

*Please keep in mind the number of doses will vary depending on a child's age and how long ago they were vaccinated. Please check with your child's provider or school for details or questions.

What if I don't have insurance? If you do not have insurance, your child may qualify for free or reduced cost immunizations. Call your providers office or Benton County Health Department for more information at 541-766-6835.

Most insurances cover immunizations. If you have insurance call your plan provider to find out if vaccines are fully covered.

Where can vaccines be given? For children ages 7 and above you can have vaccines administered at a local pharmacy. For children under the age of 7 vaccines can be administered at your provider's office or the Benton County Health Department.

****Special note: ALL incoming 7th graders are required to have a Tdap (Tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis) booster. Documentation of the vaccine is required or a non-medical exemption must be on file.**
